## Nominations

Under the provisions of Article 17 of our Articles of Association, the Honorary Offices are normally held for four consecutive one-year terms, but this may be extended for a further period under Article 18.

The Committee has nominated the following for election to one Honorary Office:

## **Professor Graeme Barker**

Graeme Barker is Disney Professor of Archaeology Emeritus at the University of Cambridge, a Senior Research Fellow in the McDonald Institute for Archaeological Research, and a Professorial Fellow of St John's College Cambridge. His research interests focus on the relations, both short- and long-term, between people and environment in the past, an interest he has pursued in temperate, tropical, semi-arid and arid regions of the world, the latter including Libya and Jordan. He was a member of the British Academy's review committee of the British Schools and Institutes that in 1994 recommended the establishment of CBRL. In 1996-2000 he co-directed the multi-period and multi-disciplinary study of the landscape archaeology of Wadi Faynan in southern Jordan that was published in 2008 as the CBRL monograph Archaeology and Desertification. He is currently leading a team investigating Neanderthal responses to climate change in Shanidar Cave in Iraqi Kurdistan. He was elected a Fellow of the Society of Antiquaries of London in 1979, a Fellow of the British Academy in 1999, and CBE in the Queen's New Year's Honours for 2015 for his services to archaeology.

## **Committee of Management**

Members of the Committee of Management serve as charity Trustees and Directors under Company Law. Under the provisions of Articles 40 and 42 of the CBRL's Articles of Association, elected members of the Committee must retire after serving for four consecutive years and are not eligible for re-election until at least one year has passed. No trustees will retire at this Annual General Meeting. No new trustees are put forward for election, however, to bring in additional skills to support the CBRL's Strategic Plan CBRL is inviting the nomination of a trustee with expertise in the management of research funding to enable CBRL to broaden its funding base.

The nominee must be a member of CBRL, resident in the UK, and be available for the meetings of the Board, which are normally four times a year (usually Wednesdays in the middle of March, June, September and December). The nominee would be expected to participate fully in the various activities and initiatives of the CBRL. Please note that the nominee's Proposer and Seconder must also be members of the CBRL but are not usually serving on the Board of Trustees. The Nominee is expected to be present at the AGM, but attendance by Proposers and Seconders, while preferable, is not a requirement.
